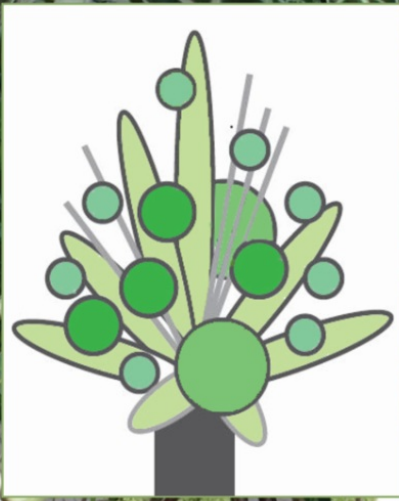

Idea #12, Traditional Mass Design

Traditional Mass Design



Supplies

1 Vase / Container
Floral Foam to fill the container
Clippers

Plant Material

Think about the design Form, Colors and Textures when choosing your plant materials.

Contrast in both Color and Texture is important as well as Rhythm with the placement of your plant materials. Look to the color wheel for contrasting colors and rough vs. smooth for textures. Remember that Traditional Mass Designs are generally geometric in shape and maybe round, oval or triangular.

Dutch and Flemish still life paintings of flowers especially of those by Jan Brueghel the Elder come to mind when one thinks of a Traditional Mass Floral Design. These paintings depicted in fine detail many varieties of flowers and not all from the same season. These paintings were generally imaginary creations of the artist making. The paintings are so life like you can almost hear the insects depicted in many of them, buzzing around the flowers and the sweet scent of floral perfume filling the air. It's no wonder that we think of these paintings when thinking of Traditional Mass Arrangements. Today, we can create those full, abundant designs which were only in the mind's eye of the artist. Flowers, fruits and vegetables which were out of season can now be physically placed together with the nature of our global markets. Full, abundant designs can be achieved in the style of the old masters.
